## **COMMUNIQUE**

The Republic of Mauritius, as the rest of the peace-loving world, is extremely concerned at the heightened degree of belligerence witnessed during the weekend in the Middle East, which, if not restrained, is bound to lead to further escalation and may spread the conflict across the region, thus putting in jeopardy peace in this part of the world.

The Republic of Mauritius urges the International Community to exercise its utmost influence on all Parties concerned to give Diplomacy a chance to settle peacefully the issue and differences that have emerged. Allowing the conflict to continue and expand will exacerbate the situation which has already reached a dangerous threshold.

The Republic of Mauritius, therefore, calls on all Parties concerned for an immediate cessation of hostilities, allow wisdom to prevail and urge them to sit at the negotiating table with a view to returning the region to a peaceful co-existence.
